Bulk Item Drop Off: Get Rid Of Your Unwanted Items

Drop off is available for Hopkins residential refuse customers only. A valid Minnesota driver's license, Minnesota ID, or current paid utility bill must be shown to prove eligibility.

When: October 1 & 2, 3-7 pm and October 3, 9 am-4 pm

Where: 1414 7th St S (old landfill site)

User Fee: \$10 per vehicle depositing material at drop site, plus \$20 for each recyclable appliance. (Fee will not be collected the day of drop off, but placed on your utility bill.)

Guidelines

- Maximum 3 cubic yards (one pick-up truck load) per household.
- Residents must separate recyclable materials into the proper areas at the site. Construction materials, appliances, and metal materials will be separated and recycled.
- Small engines and lawn mowers must have wheels and fluids removed. Caps, drain plugs, and wheels must also be removed prior to taking them to the drop off site.
- Electronics and concrete products (with no iron) are accepted at the drop off site.

Items NOT accepted in the Bulk Item Drop Off include, but are not limited to...

- Tires
- Car Parts
- Fluorescent Bulbs
- Car Batteries
- Metal Barrels or Drums
- Junk Cars
- Waste Oil
- Gas Refrigerators
- Paint Products
- Hazardous Waste
- Concrete with iron in it
- Creosote Treated Lumber (RR Ties)

Please refer to your *Recyclopedia* for options on discarding or recycling these items. Hazardous wastes must be taken to Hennepin County hazardous waste drop off sites. Call Hennepin County at 612-348-3777 for more information.

Two Free Options For Brush Disposal This Fall Free, One-Day-Only, Brush Pick Up

Free **one-day only** brush pick up will take place on **Tuesday, September 22**. Call 952-939-1382 beginning Monday, September 14, to schedule your free pick up. The last day to schedule the free pick up is Monday, September 21, before 2 pm.

This will be the only free brush pick up this fall.

Free Brush & Yard Waste Drop Off Site

The free brush and yard waste drop off site will remain open through November 28 (weather permitting). Please note hours of operation below:

- Through October 31:** Wednesdays, 2-7 pm & Saturdays, 9-3 pm
- November 1-14:** Wednesdays, 1-5 pm & Saturdays, 9-3 pm
- November 15-28:** Saturdays, 9-3 pm

The drop off site is located at 3100 Hopkins Crossroads (west side of Co Rd 73, approximately two blocks north of the Co Rd 5 intersection).

Brush must not be longer than 15 feet and no larger than 6 inches in diameter.

Unacceptable Yard Waste

- Garden Products (please place unused garden products in your regular refuse container)
- Vines (accepted as brush)
- Animal Feces
- Sod
- Logs or Lumber
- Dirt
